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6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to vaccinations; creating the
8 Parental Rights Immunization Act; providing short
9 title; requiring informed consent of parent or
10 guardian prior to administration of certain vaccines;
11 mandating submission of certain information by health
12 care providers; providing for codification; and
13 providing an effective date.

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

15 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
16 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2006 of Title 25, unless there
17 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

18 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Parental Rights
19 Immunization Act".

20 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
21 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2007 of Title 25, unless there
22 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

23 Each health care provider who administers a vaccine set forth in
24 the Vaccine Injury Table, as established by the United States
Department of Health and Human Services, shall obtain informed

1 consent from the legal representative or other adult authorized by
2 law to consent on behalf of a minor of any child to whom such
3 provider intends to administer such vaccine. Prior to administering
4 the vaccine, the health care provider shall provide relevant
5 information regarding benefits and risks of the vaccine as well as
6 information concerning the National Vaccine Injury Compensation
7 Program. Providing a copy of the Vaccine Information Statement, the
8 source of which is clearly identified, and making available for
9 review the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's
10 "Epidemiology and Prevention of Vaccine-Preventable Diseases:
11 Vaccine Excipient and Media Summary" to the legal representative or
12 other adult authorized by law to consent on behalf of a minor shall
13 constitute a minimum standard of relevant information.

14 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017.

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
