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6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to parental rights; creating the
8 Parental Rights Immunization Act; requiring health
9 care provider to obtain informed consent from legal
10 representative prior to vaccinating child; requiring
11 health care provider to provide certain information;
12 providing for codification; and providing an
13 effective date.

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

15 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
16 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2006 of Title 25, unless there
17 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

18 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Parental Rights
19 Immunization Act".

20 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
21 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2007 of Title 25, unless there
22 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

23 Each health care provider who administers a vaccine set forth in
24 the Vaccine Injury Table, as established by the United States
Department of Health and Human Services, shall obtain informed

1 consent from the legal representative or other adult authorized by
2 law to consent on behalf of a minor to whom such provider intends to
3 administer such vaccine. Prior to administering the vaccine, the
4 health care provider shall provide relevant information regarding
5 benefits and risks of the vaccine as well as information concerning
6 the National Vaccine Injury Compensation Program. Providing a copy
7 of the Vaccine Information Statement, the source of which is clearly
8 identified, and making available for review the Centers for Disease
9 Control and Prevention's "Epidemiology and Prevention of Vaccine-
10 Preventable Diseases: Vaccine Excipient and Media Summary", the
11 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Vaccine Injury Table or
12 the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Contraindications
13 and Precautions or any combination of these three resources to the
14 legal representative or other adult authorized by law to consent on
15 behalf of a minor shall constitute a minimum standard of relevant
16 information.

17 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.

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
